CAMPER MEDICATION

STEP 1: List all medications that need to be administered to your camper. Eye, ear, or nose sprays/drops should stay with the camper and do not need to be listed below. Inhalers and epinephrine auto-injectors need to remain with the camper or church counselor. Please list below the epinephrine auto-injector and the allergy so we have record of who has these devices.

NOTE: Camp's first aid station is well stocked with a wide range of common over-the-counter medications, such as Benadryl, Tylenol, creams, etc. These are available if your camper has an unexpected need. Please send <u>only</u> daily medication or emergency prescription medications. If you are bringing prescriptions or daily over-the-counter medication, they must be in the original pharmacy labeled container or original manufacturer's container. Prescription meds must have your camper's name and the correct instructions on the bottle. Send only the doses needed for the time your camper will be here. By federal law, we cannot mail home any medications that are accidentally left behind.

- **STEP 2:** Sign and fold this page. Place in resealable baggie with your camper's medication.
- **STEP 3:** Give the baggie to your church camp leader so they can turn it in during check-in at Camp. Do not pack this form or baggie of medication in the camper's suitcase.
